Our Guest Speaker: Roula Alakkiotou

Roula Alakkiotou, FAIA leads **ROULA ASSOCIATES ARCHITECTS, CHTD**, an architectural practice based in Chicago. In 1997, her peers elevated her to a **Fellow of the American Institute of Architects (FAIA)**

In Chicago, she worked with the **Chicago Department of Public Works and the City Architect's Office** where she contributed to several award winning urban and historic projects including the renovation and re-adaptation of Chicago's **Navy Pier** and the restoration and relocation of Widow Clark's house. In 1980, she founded her own firm with a particular **emphasis on large scale public sector projects**.

She **served under three mayors** as the only architect on **Chicago's Zoning Board of Appeals**. She also serves on **Chicago's Building Department Committee on Standards and Tests** reviewing and judging building permits that violate city code. She is a co-founder of Architects for Social Responsibility. She **founded and led the successful community effort to acquire and develop the Berger Park Community Center at North Sheridan Road and Granville in Chicago**. She has been named a "Living Treasure of Edgewater" by the Edgewater Society
